### **World Teachers' Day**



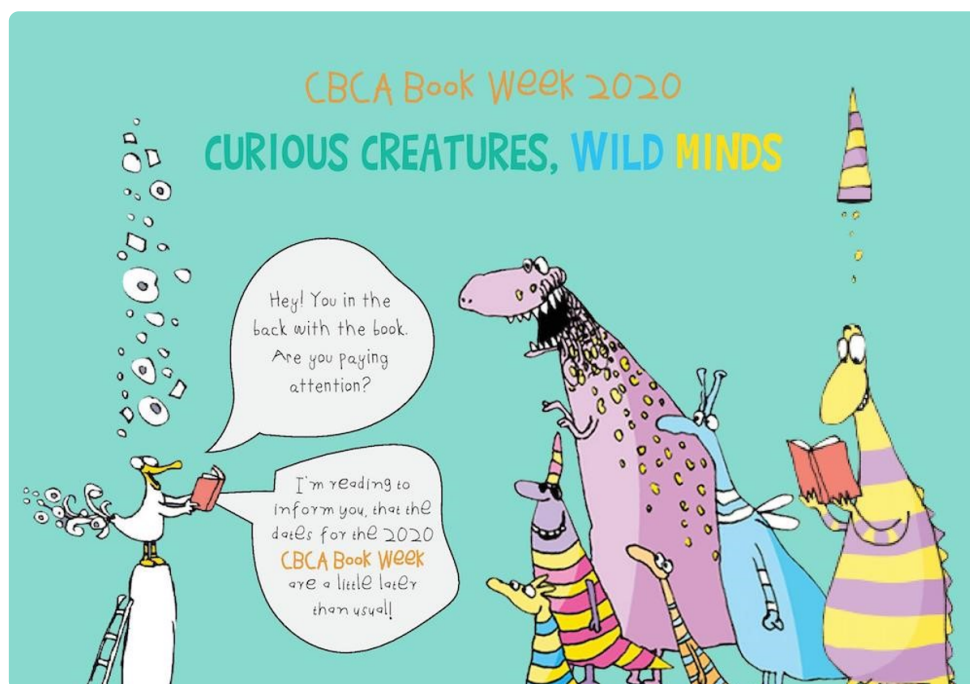

## **School Photos**

I am pleased to announce that we are having our annual school photos on Wednesday 4th November. All students are to wear their full summer uniform. No group photos are able to be taken this year. Your child will receive a composite photo of their class including their teacher. New order forms will be issued to your child, they may not arrive before photo day, however, the photographers will extend the order date so there will be plenty of time for you



to order. The Year six graduation photo will also be a composite photo this year. Sibling photos will be taken, as it does not breach Covid safe practice.

## School Fees

Firstly I would like to take this opportunity to thank you for your patience during the COVID-19 lockdown. It has been an incredibly stressful time for all, and for some, it has meant a complete change in circumstances. It looks as though we are on our way to some sort of COVID normal, and it is a great relief to us all.

I am in awe of our students and teachers. The teachers in the way they adapted to the complete change in the way they taught and for the students in how they adapted to their new way of learning.

Unfortunately, the costs associated with the lockdown were extremely high. We were able to successfully supply a device to every student in the school, and to provide support to all of our students that required extra internet data or assistance with dongles so that they could continue with the online learning.

I am aware that Mr Morrison said early on in the lockdown that all students that required a device would be given one, however, the costs were borne by the school.

Having said that, I understand that we have not been able to offer the students any excursions this year, so we will be rebating every student the cost of the excursion levy. The grade 6 families that will be leaving us at the end of the year and any families from other levels that will be leaving us will be offered a refund in the way of an EFT payment and will be contacted via an Operoo form to complete.

# A message from Fr. Pearce

2020 has already been a year of surprises, change, and disruption, and I am acutely aware that on top of all that has been going on, our inability to gather together in person has been a cause of great pain for many of you. I write to you this afternoon to inform you of one more change before the year is out. Last week the Archbishop invited me to take up a new Parish appointment as Parish Priest of St Michael's Parish in North Melbourne. This small Parish on the city's outskirts has until recently been looked after by the Blessed Sacrament Fathers, but in the last few months has returned to the Archdiocese's care.

The Archbishop would like to use this opportunity to reinvigorate the Parish, which is in a growing area of the inner city, and more closely unite it with the University of Melbourne, whose chaplaincy I took up earlier in the year. Sadly this will see me leaving Holy Family on Sunday, 15th November. Over the past five years, Holy Family has been my family, and I will be sad to be leaving, especially in the challenging times in which we live. As a Parish, we have achieved much during this time and can be proud of many things. A special mention must be made of the many young families who fill our Parish with such vibrancy. It has been wonderful to see so many families involved in our Parish's life and have seen so many youth and young adults call Holy Family home over the past five years. My new appointment sees me working closely with the Archbishop and his team to support Young People and University Students across our Archdiocese. A crucial work for our Church's future and one that I entrust to your continued prayer.

While there has not been a decision made yet about my replacement, we are incredibly lucky to have Fr Patrick Bradford, who has recently joined us. Fr Bradford will hold the fort and will be with you over these next few months as we come out of lockdown and navigate the ever-

changing environment that is COVID Normal. My departure is made much easier by knowing that I am leaving the Parish in such capable hands and that a fine priest like Fr Bradford will be with you during this time of transition. The opportunities at this time for traditional farewells will be limited. Still, I look forward to finding creative ways to say goodbye to as many as possible over the next few weeks.

May Jesus, Mary, and Joseph continue to inspire and intercede for each one of your families, and may God Bless you.

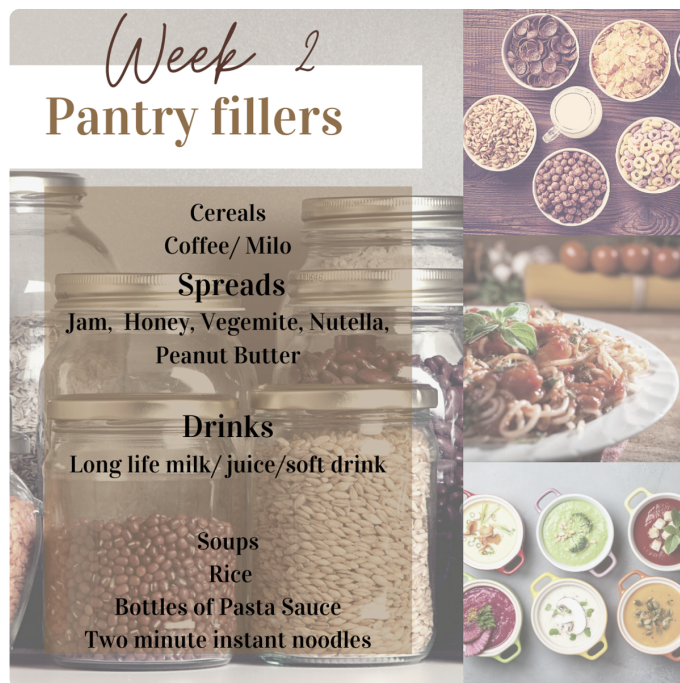
As people of faith we are always asked to consider the other before us.

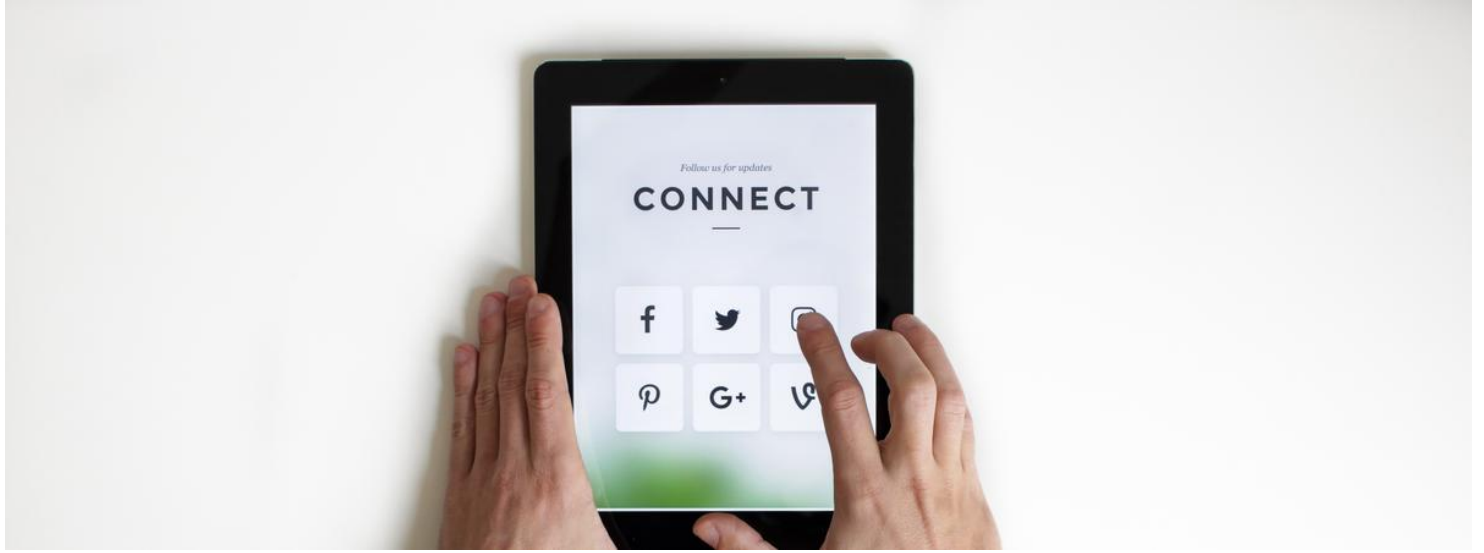

- Don't have to be a member of the Holy Family P&F!

### **The Role of the Class Representative is generally to:**

1. Act as a liaison between the teacher and parents of each individual class to organise and coordinate parent assistance (e.g. parent help on excursions/camps).
2. Assist the school in making welcome and providing support to any new families.
3. Encourage parents of the children in their year level and the broader school to get to know each other (e.g. organise social gathering with & without children on class &/or year level basis).
4. Act as a liaison between the P&F, via the Class Rep Co-ordinator, and parents of each individual class to help gather volunteers for various events through the year (e.g. special lunches days).
5. Stay on top of the school calendar and newsletter in order to help keep parents up to date.

We would love to have some new faces as Class Reps next year, to allow as many families in our community the opportunity to get involved.

#### Return to Training – Aussie Hoops

This plan has been devised to ensure a safe return to training for Aussie Hoops participants and staff, understanding and aiming to alleviate risks associated with Covid-19.

This plan is to be used by all Aussie Hoops Centres for indoor or outdoor training or exercise regardless of the geographical location and is prepared with all available information. It is important to note that each State/National jurisdiction may differ and as such it is important that Aussie Hoops Centres are well briefed on the individual expectations of their respective jurisdiction.
