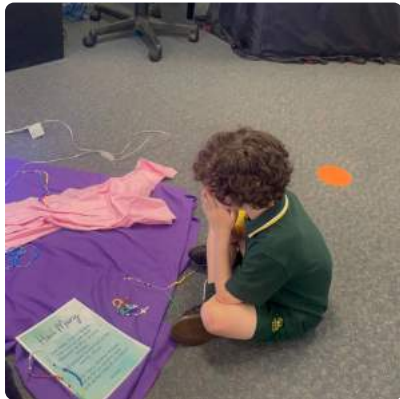

Curriculum News

SMART SPELLING AT HOLY FAM

Through our school newsletter we would like to share some information about the structured approach that we incorporate at Holy Family. From Prep-6 we explicitly and systematically teach spelling.

Spelling is best taught through pattern and regularity. Through the Smart Spelling approach we cover words that follow a consistent pattern. The remaining 20% don't have to follow a pattern, for example sight words and personal words that students still need to learn.

SMART Spelling is based around whole words with an emphasis on meaning and vocabulary development. Students are able to read their spelling words, understand what they mean and how to use them.





There are two important areas of knowledge students need to become independent spellers: phonological knowledge.

Phonological knowledge is mainly to do with sounds. It includes the ability to break words into syllables.

Orthographic knowledge is mainly to do with letters. It is a visual skill that involves choosing the correct letters. There are also two additional areas of spelling knowledge: etymological and morphemic knowledge.

Etymological knowledge is the study of where words come from.

Morphemic knowledge is how prefixes and suffixes change the meaning of base words.

A note from Learning and Teaching

Helping your children at home

One of the most common questions teachers are asked is “How can I help my child at home to improve?”
Some considerations from teachers below give

- Maths today is about understanding number patterns, not learning by rote.
- There is always more than one way to get the right answer.
- Children are taught mental strategies, like using number lines, to figure problems out in their heads.
- Ask ‘What is the question asking you?’
- Practise the times tables (years 3-6).
- Don't jump in with the answers.
- Stay positive.

As we delve deeper into problem solving and focus on cognitively demanding tasks at Holy family we the right answer or the most obvious answer, particularly in open ended tasks where there are many. Whilst many parents were taught the pen and paper algorithm, now we teach for understanding, and children have a better understanding of what is involved.

For example $22 + 14$, instead of writing these down we would ask the students to start with 22, and It is teaching them how numbers work. There is more than one way to get the right answer and our goal to them.

A positive attitude is one of the most important aspects to bring to mathematics, even if parents felt they tried.

The fortnightly newsletters that are sent home by each level will outline what the focus is for your child for further tricks and tips in the newsletter to help you help your children.

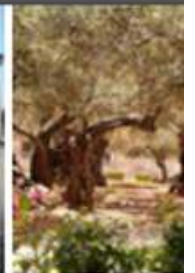

DAY 1 TUESDAY 10 OCTOBER

Depart Australia

Depart Melbourne this evening on your Emirates flight FK407 to Dubai departing at 7:30pm

DAY 2 WEDNESDAY 11 OCTOBER

Arrive Amman

On arrival into Dubai at 0530hrs, transfer to your onward Emirates flight EK901 departing for Amman, Jordan. Upon arrival into Amman this morning at 0950hrs, you will be met and welcomed by your tour guide and driver. Enjoy a brief orientation tour of Amman including a short walk to the Dome of the Rock. After lunch you will also celebrate Mass today at the Catholic Church in Amman. We will have a dinner at your hotel in Amman. (L,D)

DAY 3 THURSDAY 12 OCTOBER**Mt Nebo, Madaba, Petra**

Today you will depart Amman this morning and drive to Mt Nebo, where Moses first saw the Jordan Valley. Celebrate Mass. Continue to the mainly Christian town of Madaba to see the Mosaic Map of the world with Jerusalem at its centre. Enjoy an early lunch before the journey south and settle into your hotel before dinner and overnight in Petra. (B,L,D)

DAY 4 FRIDAY 13 OCTOBER**Full Day Petra**

Today you will tour Petra, the rose red city half as old as time. You will commence your tour by walking through the Siq, a long narrow fissure between two overhanging cliffs. You will gradually unfold the mysteries of the red rose city with its spectacular treasury, royal tombs and places of sacrifice. Return to your Petra hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)

DAY 5 SATURDAY 14 OCTOBER**Bethany on the Jordan, Jericho, Tiberias**

Depart Petra early this morning (6:00 AM) and proceed north to Bethany on the Jordan River. Celebrate Mass. Proceed to the nearby Allenby Bridge border crossing point to Israel (by 12:00PM). Visit Jericho, one of the oldest cities in the world and see the excavations there, have lunch. Visit the Jordan River and the site of the Temptation by cable car. Take the scenic drive up through the Jordan Valley to your hotel. Overnight is at your hotel overlooking the Sea of Galilee in Tiberias. (B,L,D)

DAY 6 SUNDAY 15 OCTOBER**Sea of Galilee**

After breakfast, enjoy a morning boat ride across the Sea of Galilee. You will then visit the site of the 1st Century that was found in the seabed at Nof Ginosar Kibbutz. Driving up to Tabgha you will visit the beautiful church where the Sermon on the Mount is remembered. From there you will see the Synagogue and Peter's house, center of Jesus preaching ministry. See the famous mosaic of the Loaves and Fishes and the Church of Primacy where Jesus said to Peter. Visit the recent archaeological discovery at Migdal. Return for dinner and overnight at your hotel in Tabgha (B,L,D).

DAY 7 MONDAY 16 OCTOBER**Cana, Nazareth, Nazareth**

Drive to Cana, the site of the First Miracle of turning water into wine. On to Nazareth to see the site of the Annunciation and Mary's Well. We also visit Nazareth Village, a reconstructed site, capital of Nazareth. Then a visit to the Roman remains of Zippori, which used to be a major town. Return to your hotel in Tiberias for dinner and overnight. MASS in Nazareth (B,L,D)



DAY 8 TUESDAY 17 OCTOBER

Mt Tabor, Mt Carmel, Caesar

This morning, we drive to the foot of Mt Tabor, site of the Transfiguration and take taxi to the Church of the Transfiguration. After that, we visit the ancient mosaics and other remains before passing by the Valley of Armageddon.

Visit Mt Carmel and enjoy a wonderful view across the Mediterranean Sea, River Kishon, and the cave where Elijah took refuge in his contest with the prophets of Baal. Take the coastal road to Haifa, the capital of the Roman province. There you will see the Roman and Crusader remains and the site where Paul was taken prisoner to Rome. Continue to Bethlehem for dinner and overnight at (B,L,D)

DAY 9 WEDNESDAY 18 OCTOBER

Bethlehem University, Mt. O

This morning, visit Bethlehem University, the first Catholic University in the Holy Land for an opportunity to hear about the work of the church in sustaining the University as a place of learning and an opportunity to meet present day students over lunch. Drive to the Mount of Olives for a view of the City of Jerusalem. See the Place of Ascension, commemorating Jesus' Ascension and follow the Palm Sunday Road stopping at Dominus Flevit, where Jesus wept over Jerusalem. See the Garden of Gethsemane with its ancient olive trees and enter the church of All Saints. Return to your hotel in Bethlehem for dinner and overnight. Mass at Gethsemane (B,L,D)

DAY 10 THURSDAY 19 OCTOBER

Bethlehem, Israel Museum, Y

Visit the Church of the Nativity in Bethlehem built over the stable cave of Jesus' birth. Visit the Shepherd's Fields stopping at the Church there with its blackened cave where Shepherds were warned of the birth. This afternoon, you will have lunch at a local restaurant in Bethlehem. Visit the Shrine of the Virgin Mary. Visit the Israel Museum, where the Dead Sea Scrolls are kept. You will also visit the Model of Jerusalem and the Second Temple. Visit Yad Vashem, the Holocaust Memorial museum. Continue to the Church of Visitation. Dinner and overnight is in Jerusalem. Mass at Church of Nativity (B,L,D)

DAY 11 FRIDAY 20 OCTOBER

Bethany, Masada, Qumran, D

Depart from the hotel at 07:45am. Stop at Bethany in the morning and visit Lazarus' tomb. Drive along the shores of the Dead Sea, the lowest point on earth to the fortress mountain of Masada, a symbol of Jewish resistance to the Romans in the revolt of AD 75. Ascend by cable car to see the fortress and many other archaeological excavations found. Drive to Qumran to visit the remains of the Qumran community and the caves where the Dead Sea Scrolls were hidden and discovered. Stop by the Dead Sea before returning to Jerusalem for dinner and overnight. Mass at Bethany. (B,L,D)

DAY 12 SATURDAY 21 OCTOBER

Old City of Jerusalem, Mt Zi

This morning you will start early to enter the Old City through St Stephen's Gate to visit the Church of the Virgin Mary and her parents Saints Joachim and Anne. Pass the Ecce Homo where Jesus was crowned "the man"; and walk along The Via Dolorosa ending up at the Church of the Holy Sepulcher. Continue to the Western Wall, the most holy place for Jews. Nearby is the Haram al Sharif or Temple Mount. In the afternoon, drive up to Mt Zion to see the Upper Room, the tomb of King David and the Church of Dormition. Visit the Church known as St. Peter in Gallicantu, also Caiphas' House, where Jesus was held. Return to your hotel for dinner and overnight. (B,L,D)


DAY 13 SUNDAY 22 OCTOBER
Day at Leisure

This morning, you will celebrate Mass together. The day will be free and at leisure to relax independently or do some shopping. The bus will be on hand to drive people to Tel Aviv touring. Meet back in time for dinner and overnight at your hotel in Jerusalem. (B,D)

DAY 14 MONDAY 23 OCTOBER
Depart Tel Aviv

This morning after breakfast enjoy the day at leisure. This afternoon you will be met at International Airport near Tel Aviv for your departure flight to Dubai and on to Australia.

DAY 15 TUESDAY 24 OCTOBER
Arrive Australia

Arrive back into Melbourne tonight at 2150hrs with wonderful memories of your pilgrimage
