From the Principal's Desk Mrs Julie David

2022 SCHOOL THEME - 'MAKE A DIFFERENCE'

Dear Families,

As I was having my breakfast this morning I was reading the newspaper and listening to the headlines on the radio. There appeared to be a great emphasis on NAPLAN and the top performing schools. What makes a top performing school? Is it purely based on academics? Do we allow our children to be children?

I am pleased to say that I believe Holy Family is a top performing school for a variety of reasons beyond NAPLAN.

- We have professional, dedicated and nurturing teaching staff
- Our 10 Learning Support Staff are exemplary in the manner in which they engage with our students and families
- Our teachers provide a calm and orderly learning environment
- We have small classes
- Every student is known by their name by each staff member including our Principal and Deputy Principal
- Close connections are developed with families to support the family unit as well as the children at school
- Our school provides 2 counsellors and a psychologist to support staff, families and students
- Learning opportunities are developed on the basis of up to date data for each student
- · We celebrate diversity

- We have a Prep-Year 6 Camp Program to prepare students for overnight stays in the middle and senior years
- Our Year 6 students run 'clubs' at lunchtimes as part of their Social Justice giving their time to help others
- Our staff and parents work hard to ensure that we are a welcoming community

As a parent and educator I believe the wellbeing of a student is the most important aspect of a school. If a student does not feel safe and happy then s/he will not reach his/her full potential. Students need social skills as well as an education to function fully in society. At Mass the other week, a parishioner of Holy Family, who works at Salesian, told me that the boys that come from Holy Family stand out amongst the other students for their academics and social skills. This is also the message I receive from Avila College regarding our girls who transition to this school.

Catholic Education Week

This year, all Catholic schools in the Archdiocese of Melbourne will celebrate Catholic Education Week 2022 from 13 to 20 March. The theme for Catholic Education Week 2022 is 'The Way of the Gospel'. This theme is based on Archbishop Peter A Comensoli's 2021 Pastoral Letter.

There are 335 Catholic primary and secondary schools across Melbourne, enrolling more than 150,000 students and employing approximately 17,000 staff. Catholic schools provide a high-quality education in a faith-centred environment. This annual event is held to promote the special ethos of Catholic schools and to highlight the great things that take place in Catholic schools every day.

On Friday 18th March our students will engage in a walk around 4 stations to engage with different gospels on the themes of - reconciliation, love, inclusion and justice. The station with a focus on inclusion will also include an activity for 'Bullying No Way' Day.

Life is busy! Calendars seem to be filled to the brim at the moment and while all this busyness is good, sometimes I get to Sunday night and wonder where the weekend went. What rest was achieved. I take a second to pause and wonder if I am the only one who is stuck in a busy bubble, not really able to cope with things beyond what is penned into the calendar.

Lent calls us to stop, to pray, to fast and to give. My heart goes out to all those who have been affected by the floods in New South Wales and Queensland who have lost so much. And yet their stories of community and support coming from these areas are inspiring. So many people helping neighbours clean up even though they have lost everything as well. It's jokingly labelled the Aussie way, but maybe we can learn something from our neighbours too. All the information you need to know...

THE RUN

- Commencing 5pm and concluding at 6pm
- It involves running/walking a set, short course around the school and having coloured powder thrown at you. It is non-toxic and biodegradable. It is 98% cornflour. If you are asthmatic, please consider wearing a face mask. At the end of the run, there will be a BIG colour surprise.

AFTER THE RUN

 We will gather as a community on the quadrangle, listen to DJ Phil from 5.30pm and enjoy our picnic and seeing each other again.

WHAT TO BRING

- Picnic rugs/chairs etc for your family.
- Picnic food for your family.
- Please no nuts or sharing with other families.
- · Families will be asked to take home their rubbish
- As the event is on school grounds with children present, it is an alcohol free event.

WHAT TO WEAR

- A white t-shirt or light coloured clothing is best to show up the colour. Please wear old clothes
- We will do our best to throw the powder at the torso, however wind and other factors can cause
 the powder to protrude on the face. You may wish to bring your own eye protection such as
 sunglasses or goggles.

WHERE TO PARK

- The car park at the back of the church (entrance via David Court) will be closed from 3.30pm
 Friday afternoon to allow for set up
- Staff/Church carpark will be closed from 4pm Friday afternoon as we will be using this space for the run
- · Please allow time to find alternative parking.

We need help on the day/night. Can you help set up? Clean up? Or throw colour? Please volunteer via the sign up notification in the coming week.

Families are requested to follow COVID safe practices. Please QR Code into the school on entry into the event. Please maintain 1.5m distance or wear a face mask.






A message from your Coordinator
