RELIGION

Mary as a Disciple



This term in religion we are exploring Mary, the mother of Jesus Christ's journey to discipleship and the different portrayals of Mary through the lens of the Bible. Throughout this unit students will learn about the importance of Mary in the church and her role as the first disciple. They will explore times where Mary has been identified in the Bible and what kind of role model she is for us as a disciple in the church today.

In weeks 8 and 9 the students will revise all they have learnt about Mary, the mother of Jesus, and will discuss how she demonstrated discipleship. During these weeks the students will be provided an opportunity to share their learning and understanding of Mary's portrayal throughout the New Testament. Their knowledge will be assessed through the completion of 2 activities:

- 1. Writing a journal entry reflecting on what they have learnt about Mary
- 2. Putting themselves into the picture students will draw a picture of themselves representing how they see themselves in relation to the topic of discipleship.

LITERACY

The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe by C. S. Lewis

Throughout term 4 the year 3/4s have explored the classic C. S. Lewis novel 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe'. Students have explored the vast tier 2 vocabulary used throughout the story, in order to support their understanding of the text. This tier 2 vocabulary has been displayed around the classroom to encourage students to level up their writing.



As each chapter has been read the class has analysed a 'big question', which introduced students to different themes and connections between learning areas. One area explored is the connection between character development and plot and the Catholic faith. Students identified the similarities between Aslan and Jesus Christ and were able to use their knowledge of Biblical events to predict where the story may journey next.

In weeks 8 and 9 students will complete reading 'The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe' and will engage in activities to reflect and analyse the themes, characters and storyline. Students will write chapter summaries, character biographies and share their interpretations of the text.







Week 9: trigraph /ear/ (in words like near, smear and gear)

MATHEMATICS







Measuring Mass:

- Students will use scaled instruments to measure, order and compare objects using familiar metric units of mass.

Interpreting Data:

Students will also revise statistics by interpreting data and displaying this data in the form of graphs.

INQUIRY





Our inquiry unit for term 4 focuses on communication, digital technologies and data representation. In this unit students will make the connection between physical forms of communication and how data represented digitally is also a form of communication. Students will explore a variety of forms of communication, including morse code, braille, QR codes and algorithms.

In weeks 8 and 9 students will continue learning about codes. They will practice creating different types of codes and will learn about encrypting messages and breaking codes.

DreamCity Incursion

In week 8, to complement the student's learning about communication and digital technologies, the year 3/4s will participate in an incursion run by DreamCity. The students will be exposed to 3 different forms of digital technologies and how they can be used to communicate information.
