

RELIGION	This term we have been looking at Biblical Stewardship. Throughout the term, we have looked at the impact that humans have had on different animals through our Inquiry unit. In religion we explore what it means to be a caretaker of God's Kingdom, and the qualities we need to have to be a good Steward.

LITERACY



Reading: In Reading, we will continue building comprehension and research skills. This involves:

- 1. Defining the task. What exactly must be researched? .
- 2. Discovering Keywords.
- 3. Using appropriate tools.
- 4. Learning about source hierarchy and evaluation.
- 5. Taking notes and compiling information.
- 6. Setting up lifelong skills.

Scientific Reports: The students have begun to write their Scientific Reports on their Mouldy Bread Experiment. Students will learn how to record their results and analyse them scientifically.

Spelling Focus:

Week 9: Digraph /sc/ making the sound "s" as in 'scissors'

Week 10: Prefixes /macro/ meaning large, and /micro/ meaning small.

MATHS



Students will finish up the term with their Financial Maths unit.

Some examples of financial maths students will explore include:

- · Counting change at your local shop.
- The Stock Exchange, with major offices in Sydney and Melbourne.
- Paying bills, such as utility bills or after a meal in a restaurant.
- Calculating the tax of items. This can range from GST, the Goods and Services Tax of items, to council tax, income tax, corporation tax and excise tax on items such as petrol and alcohol.
- Econometrics is a very advanced form of financial Maths. It's used by economists who use statistical methods to analyse economic data.
